Happy 65th Anniversary to our school!

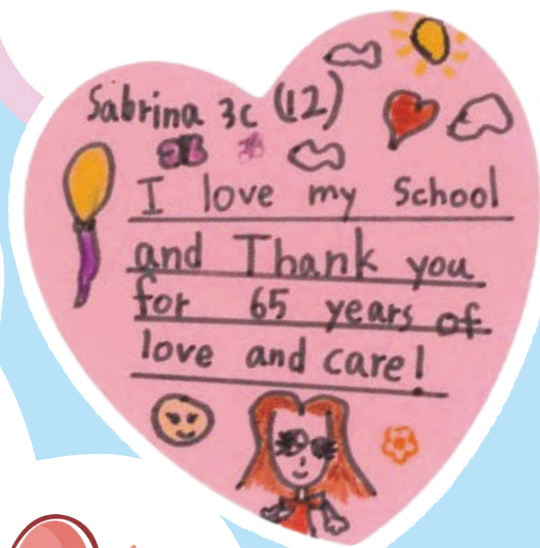

5B Wu Yat Hei Alvin (Group Y)

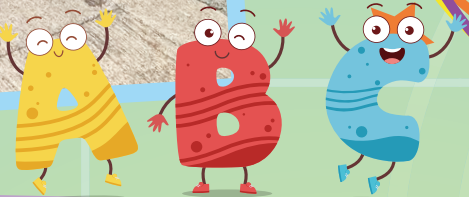

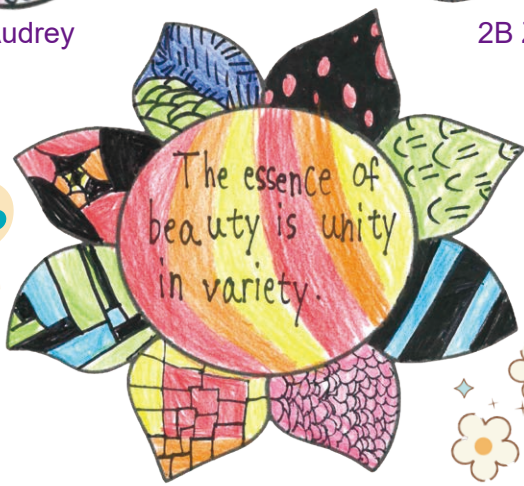

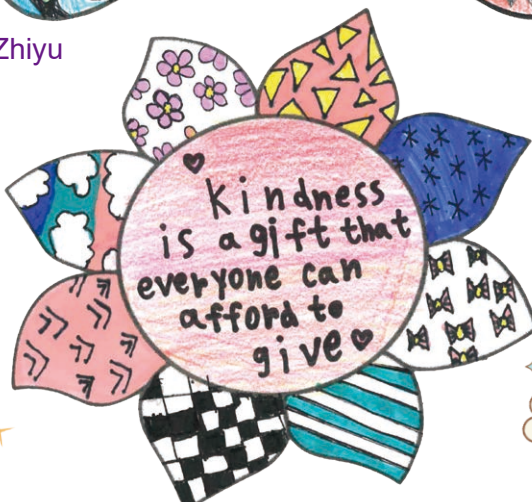
